Animal Health Corner Boating with Dogs

- If your dog has not been on a boat before, acclimate them slowly, entice them with treats and try to make it a positive experience.
- Invest in a dog life vest. Should your dog fall overboard, it will keep them afloat. Vests often have a handle on the back to help grab them out of the water!
- Have a First Aid Kit on board for minor cuts and injuries.
- Don't forget sunscreen for noses and underbellies. Make sure the sun screen does not contain zinc oxide, which is toxic if ingested. Baby sunscreen or dog-specific sunscreen is recommended.
- Watch for signs of sea sickness.
 Vomiting, dry heaving or drooling are signs to watch for. If your dog shows these signs, head to shore.
 Talk with your veterinarian about medications that might help if it happens regularly.
- Always have fresh water available to keep your pup hydrated.
